Spectrum Center offers a nonpublic school program for children ages 3 to 22. The Solano Campus serves students with challenging educational and behavioral needs, including the following disabilities: autism, emotional disturbance or dual diagnosis, limited cognitive ability, communication disorders, ADHD, and multiple handicaps.

Our Classrooms Provide:

- Instruction in alternative appropriate behaviors and self control strategies
- Well trained staff with experience using Applied Behavior Analysis to address challenging behaviors
- Ongoing communication and support for parents and families
- Curriculum based on each student's unique educational needs and IEP
- High staff to student ratios
- Resolution to immediate placement problems and facilitation of transition back to public schools



Vocational Services

All students ages 14 and up participate in vocational services including Workability and, when appropriate, on and off campus job placements. Our goal is to provide students with the skills necessary for independence and future employment. Our services include:

- Comprehensive assessments to determine strengths and interests
- Matching vocational training to strengths and interests
- On and off campus paid work experience, including clerical work, facilities maintenance, campus student store, Safeway, the animal shelter, and Coffee World



Academic Classrooms

Academic classrooms are designed to address the needs of students with academic and behavioral needs, providing:

- Academic instruction that addresses IEP goals and CA State Content Standards
- Graduation track classrooms that prepare students to earn a high school diploma
- Social skills training
- Functional and daily living skills
- Empirically-based instructional methods (Direct Instruction)

Spectrum Center's Autism Initiative

The Solano Campus offers a full continuum of education services for children with autism, including:

- Strong language development curriculum
- Emphasis on social development
- Teaching methodologies include, discrete trial, Pivotal Response, PECS, and TEACCH
