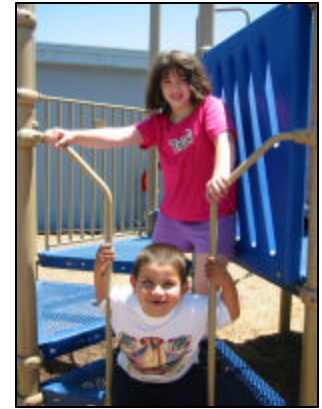


Every Student Succeeds!

Spectrum Center offers a nonpublic school program for students ages 3 to 22. The Tara Hills Campus serves students with challenging educational and behavioral needs, including the following disabilities: *autism, moderately to severely handicapped, multiple handicapped, emotional disturbance, deaf, blind, and hearing impaired.*

Our classrooms provide:

- Instruction in alternative appropriate behaviors and self control strategies
- Curriculum based on each student's unique educational needs and IEP
- Resolution to immediate placement problems and facilitate transition back to public schools
- Ongoing communication and support for parents and families
- High staff to student ratios
- Well trained staff with experience with Applied Behavior Analysis and challenging behaviors
- Therapeutic services by a licensed MFT if appropriate
- Frequent community integration opportunities



Spectrum Center's Autism Initiative

Spectrum Center offers a full continuum of education services for children with autism. Classrooms provide:

- Strong language development curriculum
- Emphasis on social development
- Applied Behavior Analysis
- Positive strategies to address challenging behaviors
- Discrete trial training, natural language paradigm, Picture Exchange Communication (PECS), TEACCH, and pivotal response training

Vocational Services

All students ages 14 and over participate in vocational services, including WorkAbility and, when appropriate, on and off campus job placements. An individualized vocational program is developed based on various assessments in collaboration with the student's Individual Education Team.

Academic Classrooms

Academic classrooms are designed to address the needs of students with academic and behavioral needs, providing:

- Academic instruction addressing IEP goals and CA State Content Standards
- Graduation track options
- Social skills training
- Self-control, behavioral support curriculum
- Pre-vocational and vocational training
- Functional and daily living skills
